

COOTIE CATCHER

(FOLDED PAPER GAME)

FOLDING INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Cut out square cootie catcher and place face down.
2. Locate the center by folding horizontally first, then vertically.
3. Fold corners toward center of paper.
4. Flip your paper over so the folded sides are face down.
5. Again, fold corners toward center diagonally.
6. Hold the paper in front of you like a square. Fold it in half vertically and open it back up again.
7. Then fold the square in half horizontally and open it back up again. Make sure that the numbers you've written are facing you.
8. Flip the paper over again so that the words AIDS, POVERTY, HUNGER and WAR are face up. Fold the square in half, either horizontally or vertically. Slide your thumbs and fingers under the four flaps.
9. Finally, rotate your hands, bringing your thumbs and index fingers together. The cootie catcher should expand. The numbered triangles will disappear inside. Then open and begin using your cootie catcher.

GAME INSTRUCTIONS (two players):

1. Choose a word from the four options. Spell the word by expanding the cootie catcher.
2. Choose a number from the four exposed options. Count the same number by expanding the cootie catcher.
3. Select another number. Open the cootie catcher and read what's underneath to learn something new!
